This is in response to your petition expressing concern about an editorial in The Globe and Mail on Feb.15 referring to a Hamas video.

We have spent considerable time looking into the concerns and complaints from a number of people in your petition and have responded to a number of them. Let me deal with your questions:

Plagiarism.

Plagiarism is taking the prose or unique ideas of someone else and suggesting it is your own prose or unique ideas. This is clearly not the case with this editorial.

Unnamed source/need for correction.

The main issue for us is that the video is real, is really on a Hamas website and that the translation was accurate. We had an Arabic speaker listen to the video as it appeared on palestinegallery.com, which is hosted on palestine-info.net. We have been assured by various experts that it is fair to describe these websites as Hamas sites. Since we have no evidence that the editorial is incorrect, we would not write a correction.

Develop relationships, both formal and informal.

As you know, we have a full time correspondent in the Middle East, Mark MacKinnon, who writes fair and balanced copy about that region. We have also encouraged a number of Arab and Muslim writers to write for our comment page. We are meeting with one group next month.
